Where is the class?

There are 4 classes this semester. Three on campus at Rio Hondo College and there is one here at the Department of Public Works (Conference room E). When?

This month. Spring semester. Starts the week of January 27th. First day of class at LA Public Works office is Tuesday January 28th at 6pm. Class at DPW meets

Can I register online?

Yes. Here are the steps. Please note, registration for you starts January 8th and 9th (goes by last name initial). Class will fill quickly. However, you will be unable to register unless you apply for admission which again can be done entirely online (takes normally two days and you will be provided your student number to then permit you to register for the class)

How do I register?

You can apply for admission and register entirely online. Here are the steps to guide you thru applying for admission and for registration. If interested. Please apply for admission ASAP as class will fill quickly (and soon).

What are the requirements?

There is no prerequisite for the class to add GIS120 (Introduction). The An introduction class can be waived if you have experience in using or equivalent classes take elsewhere if registering for other classes such as the GIS220 Intermediate class (the class is already filled).

How large is the class?

Registration will be open for 24 seats.
